





Letter from the EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR

Just over 7 years ago MWS launched our first expedition. Five students and two instructors hiked out into the Taylor-Hilgard mountains on our first mountaineering expedition: 21 days in the Montana backcountry. One student struggled and eventually went home, but the other four students found their mountain legs and grit and successfully completed what was for most of them a life-changing experience.

In 2021, more than ever before in my lifetime, I feel like these experiences are crucial. I've often had folks say why don't you just do short overnight or weekend trips instead of these longer more involved experiences. The answer for me is easy. The "realness" doesn't surface until you are really in it, committed, raw, exposed, tired, and smelly. On a backcountry expedition every day you have to earn it, and the power and confidence that comes from doing hard things is something you will take with you the rest of your life.

MWS ran our busiest and most impactful season ever this year. Not only did we triple the number of students served in past seasons, but we added new courses, partnered with 5 other organizations to run expeditions together, provided over \$138,000 in financial aid to local Montana students, more than ever before. MWS also continued to build bridges – increasing the diversity of our students in terms of culture, gender, race, and socioeconomics. Not only has MWS survived as a new local nonprofit organization in just 7 years, but we are thriving right now at a time when youth need these experiences more than ever.

I continue to be extremely grateful for our amazing community: our participants and their families, our staff and volunteer board members, our grant and business sponsors, and all the donors that make all of this possible. Thank you again for being important in our family here at the school. Without all of you MWS would never have made it and thank you for continuing to be here and help us move forward to impact the lives of more youth in the years ahead. Stay Wild,

2021 Youth Wilderness PROGRAM REPORT

The 2021 season was a tremendous year of growth for MWS as we more than doubled our student numbers and tripled our expedition offerings. We maintained the 2020 implementation of the policies, procedures and guidelines to mitigate the spread of GOVID-19, including pre-course testing. MWS successfully ran twelve open enrollment expeditions and five contract expeditions. We overcame numerous logistical challenges from wildfires to staffing shortages and I am happy to report that 166 students had fundamentally transformative experiences in the unique wild lands of Montana and Idaho. Students were immersed in wild places from 4-25 days and educated about wilderness self-care and community building, camp craft, Leave No Trace ethics, leadership and communication skills, mountaineering, rock climbing, canoeing, packrafting, horse packing and backpacking. We successfully offered and ran three new course types this year: The Introduction to Packrafting Adventure, Montana Expedition, and Yellowstone Backpacking Expedition. We also worked in a new course area for our Wilderness Backpacking and Packrafting expedition running the Salmon River in Idaho.

The 2021 field season provided a number of learning opportunities for MWS from organizational growing pains to logistical challenges. With the health of our staff and students as our foremost priority, we maintained our comprehensive GOVID-19 protocols and guidelines for students and staff. We also continued our rigorous medical screening and testing we applied to all students and staff in an attempt to create "Covid-free cohorts" for each expedition. In addition, the wildfire season was long and created a number of logistical challenges and

health concerns with unhealthy air in many of our course areas and was the result of a cancelation of one contract course. Like many other sectors of the national and local community, MWS also experienced a shortage of qualified workers and made some hires mid-season that were critical to a successful summer. A very strong commitment to the program by invested staff members maintained the high caliber of MWS expeditions, and feedback from students and parents indicate that we made a very positive impact in the lives of our participants. Enrollment was strong with our expanded course offerings, and the outreach and enrollment team did an exceptional job with limited in-person and substantial online recruiting.

The contract course program grew substantially from previous years. By and large most of these trips were very successful. We look forward to working with some of our partner organizations again next year and the groundwork is already being set for collaborating with SEO Scholars, NYC, and BYEP in Bozeman again.

Once again, we were able to provide full or partial scholarships to over 66% of our Montana students and no interested participant was turned away from MWS for financial reasons. As 2022 approaches we also look forward to getting our feet under us, as we become a larger organization and will work to continue improving the program's operations. We remain committed to making MWS more diverse, inclusive and equitable, with a goal of improving enrollment particularly in underserved urban, rural, and native communities around Montana.
